The second way to support GDA and Christian education is through the MO Scholars Program. The Herzog Tomorrow Foundation has distributed

\$197,625 in MO Scholars scholarship dollars to GDA students this year. What a blessing!

The best part, is that it costs you nothing. Any entity (individuals or businesses) in the state with Missouri income tax liability can participate in MOScholars scholarships by reserving a 100% taxcredit for up to 50% of your tax liability to help 26 GDA students still awaiting MOScholars scholarships.

Example: If a business or individual owes \$10,000 in Missouri income tax in 2022, they can make a \$5,000 donation to Herzog, and then they will only owe the state \$5,000. So, it is essentially a redirection of tax dollars – it costs the donor nothing.

GDA families have given \$684,524 from July to November! In case you missed it, we are in Phase 2 of the following project and we are raising money for Phase 3, to give our students a finished gymnasium and classrooms. As 2022 comes to a close, it is easy to look back and see how God has blessed Gloria Deo Academy. The campaign to give our students a finished gymnasium and additional classrooms is under way and we are excited to see how God will provide each of us the gifts to help in some way. Help us give thanks for the many blessings this year, including:

- Our students are continually growing in Christ.
   It is evident every day in how they present themselves at school, at events and tournaments.
- The Herzog Foundation has granted GDA \$425,000 towards our campaign. As the funds for our project get pledged, funds from the grant get released.
- GDA was awarded the Excellence in Giving Certificate. This is an independent, third-party nonprofit who examines the financial data, analytics, strategies, and leadership to ensure transparency, fiscal responsibility and viability.
- Massada Utility Contractors, LLC (our next-door neighbors at the Golden property) are donating the use of their property for improved ingress/egress for drop-off and pick-up. Not only that, but they are paying the expenses to remove the fence and the trees, level the ground between our properties and create more parking for GDA to use.
- The second part of phase 2 is in progress. The builders met on property last week and said they hope to begin installing the first set of stairs in January, with the entire phase 2 being completed by the spring.
- From July to today, \$684,524 (not including the Herzog grant) has been raised! Any cash that has been received, plus pledges coming in are being placed in a designated building account at the Community Foundation of the Ozarks.

Once enough funds are pledged, we can begin construction on the gymnasium.

Remodel gymnasium to add sport flooring, stage, storage, audio, video, lighting, a classroom, HVAC, and furnishings.

# WHAT IS CLASSICAL EDUCATION?

For most parents seeking academic rigor for their students, Classical Education is the pinnacle of educational achievement, the apex of a successful foundation for lifelong success. Classical Education has a reputation for setting a strong standard for its students, equipping them to learn through excellent curriculum and instruction, and its superiority is solidified through proven demonstration of the output of well-educated citizens. But what is Classical Education, and why should we pursue it for our children?

Classical Education is far more than cyclical history

and Latin studies, although most would define it as such; and that is a part of its format, its exterior dress, if you will, but there is so much more within the soul of Classical Education. Parents quickly grasp that it's an ancient method of teaching with substantiated results. But how does it work? What is it? Let's begin with why we should utilize Classical pedagogy, then move on to its method.

Outside of the Christian Worldview, the purpose of Classical Education is to educate the whole man: body, mind, and spirit; to educate beyond mere utility for the betterment of the individual. To teach



students how to learn. This same purpose drives the Christian Classical educator as well, but we have a deeper, nobler end in mind. Simply stated, the purpose of Classical Education from a Christian Worldview seeks to "repair the ruin of our first parents," (Milton). What this means, in essence, is to bridge the gap as well as possible that comes from the Fall; to regain knowledge and intimacy with God. God has revealed much of his character through his General Revelation, which is the observable world around us. We can learn more of who He is, and learn to love Him more by learning all we can through science, math, poetry, language, art, woodworking, history, reasoning, Theology, etc. Since everything was created by God, learning more about those created things reveals the nature of the Creator, Christian Classical Education puts God at the center of every learning endeavor. All subjects point to Him, and He points to all subjects, thereby integrating all areas of learning.

Education is not so much about the subjects we study as it is about the skills we master in order to be self-learners; the subjects are merely the areas in which we practice those skills. Classical education highlights the skills, or "Tools" as Dorothy Sayers identifies them (Sayers), and are divided into three areas of age-development and, concurrently,

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three areas of skills, or arts, known as the Trivium, which means "three roads" or "three ways". Those three areas are Grammar (knowledge), Dialectic (logic), and Rhetoric (wisdom). Understanding the progression of skills in each area allows learners to know immediately where to begin studying a new subject, and how to move through the skills in each area toward mastery of that subject. This learning method creates people who can teach themselves anything, who can approach any and every subject with confidence and skill.

By mastering the skills of the Trivium, anyone can learn anything and thereby begin to "know God aright and out of that knowledge to love him, to imitate him, to be like him, as we may the nearest by possessing our souls of true virtue," (Milton).


